Citizens Advice Bureau

The Treasurer of the Selby Citizens Advice Bureau attended the meeting to talk to the Parish Council about the Citizens Advice Bureau.

He asked the Parish Council if they were aware of how the CAB obtained there funding.

Funding from the CAB comes from NYCC Selby Council and Parish Councils.

The services of the CAB are available to all members of the community. Selby Cab is run by 5 full time members and 20 voluntary members. Over 5 years.

The CAB wants further funding for an Outreach project. They need funding for placement and phone advisors. They need suitable premises in which to hold the Outreach Sessions.

The CAB is looking for extra support from parishes. County Cllr Mrs Hulme asked how many residents in Camblesforth have been helped by the CAB. She was told that these figures were not to hand.

When the Outreach services go out into the community the Cab will need help in the form of money or the provision of rent free properties for the CAB to use for the Outreach programme. The only suitable venues in the Parish would be the Village Chapel or the School.

The Treasurer hoped that the Parish Council would consider the CAB when planning the next year's precept. The Chairman thanked the Treasurer giving the talk.

Minutes The minutes of the meeting of 18 March 2008 were approved and signed.

Alcohol exclusion zone The Police were not available to attend the meeting. The clerk to request that they attend the next meeting.

Mosquito on mini market the mosquito has been repaired. The problem was caused because it had been set on reversed polarity. The children still sit outside the shop and do not appear bothered by it. The mosquito has been checked and is working.

Village Hall

The Clerk has received a response from the Charity Commission. The Parish Council can assume trusteeship of the Village Hall. They need to contact the Methodist Church and ask

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Them if they wish to be Trustees to the Village Hall. The Methodist Church was part of the original group of Trustees.

County Cllr Mrs Hulme said that there is funding available from Wren which could be applied for.

Mrs Rocklike said that the school paid half for the crockery in the village hall. The Parish Councillors gave her permission to collect the crockery and also any toys that might be useful. The clerk to contact Mr Tinsley concerning the bar equipment.

Planning Applications and approvals

Application for the renewal of planning permission on 23-29 Brigg Lane. The Parish Council did not raise any objections

Application to build a bungalow to the rear of Rosedene Brigg Lane. The Parish Council expressed their concern about the access to the property as this is a congested area for parking. Granted Planning approval for houses on the rear of 10 Brigg Lane.

Correspondence

Survey on Children's needs to complete. Mrs Walsh to deal with.

Parish Plan letter from Councillor Spetch to request the financial support of the Parish Council for the Fun Day. The Parish Plan Committee has been granted £180 by the CIPS group. The Parish Council agreed to donate £150. This was proposed by Kevin Wild and seconded by James Neale.

Letter of Complaint the Parish Council has received a letter of complaint. Unfortunately it arrived too late to be added to the agenda for this meeting. The Chairman assured the meeting that the correct procedure for complaints would be followed.

Several Complaints have been made on the matter of emptying the bins on time to the District Council and the Recycling Officer has spoken to the contractors on the matter.
