Camblesforth Village Open Gardens 2017

Once again Camblesforth open gardens and produce show will take place again this year, with a Flower & Vegetable Show, Food Produce Show, and stalls, to be held on Saturday, 29th July 2017

There will be classes for vegetables and fruit, to include, potatoes, carrots, peas, runner beans, lettuce, tomatoes, beetroot, onions, raspberries, courgettes, cucumbers, herbs and a "Master Gardener" class comprising of a pot plant, cut flowers, a vegetable and a fruit. The flower classes include, roses, sweet peas, a vase of mixed flowers, flower arrangement, and a pot plant.

Produce classes will include fruit jam, marmalade, Victoria sponge, bread loaf, decorated sponge, fruit scones, apple pie, sausage rolls, fruit loaf, iced buns and teacakes.

There will be classes for children including: a vegetable character, miniature garden, iced buns, gingerbread character and chocolate crispies.

We are requesting residents of Camblesforth to open their gardens for public access on the day between 1.00pm and 5.00pm. It's a great opportunity to meet both residents and visitors. The theme for this year will be "Witches and Wizards" and residents, whether opening their gardens or not, are invited to decorate their houses and gardens or make and display a witch or wizard themed model or "scarecrow".

Anyone who has items they would like to sell e.g. "bric-a-brac", crafts etc., or put on a display of items of interest, e.g. special collections, photographs, hobbies, historical items etc. can put up a stall either in their garden or in the village Memorial Garden.
