Fruit and Vegetable Classes – All presented on a plate, unless otherwise stated. Entries may be of any single variety

Class 1	Four potatoes
Class 2	Four carrots - with leaf
Class 3	Five pods of peas
Class 4	Six pods of runner beans
Class 5	Six pods of broad beans
Class 6	Single head of lettuce, in a jar of water
Class 7	Six ripe tomatoes
Class 8	Six green tomatoes
Class 9	Four beetroot- with tops
Class 10	Four onions
Class 11	Six raspberries
Class 12	Three sticks of rhubarb
Class 13	Six gooseberries
Class 14	Six spring onions
Class 15	Six radishes
Class 16	Two leeks
Class 17	Two courgettes
Class 18	Two cucumbers
Class 19	Single head of cabbage
Class 20	Three mixed fruit or vegetables, two of each variety
Class 21	Longest runner bean
Class 22	Heaviest onion

Class 24	Four different culinary herbs in a jar of water
Class 25	Master Gardener - One pot plant, one vase of cut flowers, one fruit, one vegetable

Flower Classes

Class 26	Six roses - any colour - in a vase – home grown
Class 27	Six sweet peas - any colour - in a vase – home grown
Class 28	Vase of mixed flowers - any variety – home grown
Class 29	Pot Plant - any variety
Class 30	Succulent or Cactus
Class 31	Flower arrangement – “A Magic Spell” – flowers may be bought

Cookery Classes

Class 32	1lb Jar of Fruit Jam – any variety
Class 33	1lb Jar of Marmalade
Class 34	Savoury quiche
Class 35	Four Sausage Rolls (rough puff or flaky pastry)
Class 36	1lb Bread Loaf

All entries must be presented to the appropriate venue within the times stipulated within the schedule or it will not be entered.

For flower, vegetable and produce classes this is to be at Camblesforth Church between 08.00 and 10.00 on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> July.

All entries must be entered in the name of the original producer or creator

Vegetables shall be clean.

Carrots and beetroot shall be presented with tops intact.

Lettuce shall be with root and clean of any foreign matter.

Onions shall have their roots cut and tops trimmed. Tying of trimmed tops is permitted.

Cabbages shall be root trimmed and clean of any foreign matter

Spring onions shall be clean and root trimmed

Heaviest onion entries shall be root cut and tops trimmed to no longer than 3ins (75mm)

Measurement of the longest carrot shall exclude the tops

Roses and Sweet Peas shall be displayed without foliage, i.e. clean stemmed.

The Sweet Peas shall be in a straight-sided container.

Note – in classes 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30, it is the quality of the flowers or plant that is being judged, not the presentation.

The flower arrangement, class 31 shall be no larger than 2ft x 2ft x 2ft (600mm x 600mm x 600mm)

Fruit jam or marmalade must be presented in a plain 1lb (454g) jar, with plain lid, and must be covered internally by a wax disc. Paper or fabric lid covers are permitted.

Each class shall be split as follows:-

- Up to and including 12 years old - Junior
- 13 years and above- Senior
- Children only – classes 45 to 49

Note - By entering this competition all entrants affirm that the produce shown has been grown and raised or cooked by them.

- Each class will be judged based upon quality of produce, consistency of groups, and presentation.
- The judge's decision will, in all cases, be final and not subject to appeal.
- The fee of 25p per entry is to accompany the entry form which shall be completed on the day. Entry fees shall not be refundable.
- All entries shall be at the church by 10.00am on the 29<sup>th</sup> July and may not be removed before 5.00pm. **Judging will take place between 10.30 and 12.00** and the church will not be open to public or exhibitors during this period.
- Certificates will be awarded to first, second and third prize winners of each class. Where there are less than three entries in a class the award of prizes will be at the judge's discretion. Points will be awarded for first, second and third places and a trophy will be awarded to the person with the highest number of points scored in the Flower and Vegetable classes, and in the Cookery Classes

#### **Stalls and Displays.**

1. Each stallholder is responsible for compliance with current legislation, rules on hygiene and trading standards requirements.
2. Stallholders selling items or produce are asked to make a voluntary donation of at least £10, which will be shared evenly between a nominated charity and Church Funds.
3. Stalls for displays/exhibitions are free of charge - stallholders are asked to have a collection box available for Charity / Church Fund donations.
4. Displays can be of applicant's own work or craft, collections of interest, photographs etc.
5. Displays and gardens shall be available for public view by 1.00 pm on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> July and shall remain available until 5.00pm.
