Changing the way we deal with waste at household waste recycling centres - tell us what you think

As a result of Government funding cuts, our budget is being reduced and we now need to deliver millions of pounds in savings. The household waste recycling centre (HWRC) service currently costs £5.9 million; we need to save £240,000 in 2014/15, but we may need to save more in future. To achieve this, we need to change the way we deal with discretionary wastes like soil and rubble and other non-household wastes at our HWRCs.

Our proposal is to charge customers for soil and rubble or refuse to accept it at our HWRCs and treat plasterboard in the same way.

We are also consulting on other options to make savings beyond 2015.
